Congratulations to all our Year 12 students who have continued to work solidly towards HSC. their During Week 1 Term 4 we will still run timetabled lessons for our Year 12 students to support them prior to the exbeginning on ams Tuesday 20th October.

The school has put together a COVID HSC safety plan should the exams be disrupted by a lockdown initiated by NSW Health. The comprehensive plan has been included with their Year 12 reports distributed today.

At this stage no exams will be cancelled or rescheduled. In the event of a lockdown students will be notified via SMS and directed to one of two alternative venues: Rockdale PCYC or St George Girls Hiah School.

All students should continue to practice good hygiene and physical distancing. Where physical distancing is not possible masks should he worn.

During the examination period students should arrive at least 30 minutes early to sign the health declaration, hand sanitise and prepare for entry to the exam room.

Any student who is unwell should contact the school immediately on 9587 5815. Students who have been

directed to self-isolate or are awaiting the results of a COVID test should contact the school immediately and remain at home.

Finally, I want to wish our Year 12 students all the very best for their exams in what has been a particularly challenging year. Their resilience and determination are a credit these to amazing young people.
